國立東華大學應用數學系外國學生南向獎學金施行要點

- 第一條 國立東華大學(本校)應用數學系(本系)為配合本校南向獎學金之實行,特訂定本要點,自106學年度起,試行三年。
- 第二條 本獎學金申請案由本系招生委員會進行初審,並排列推薦受獎學生之優先順序,本 院國際事務暨獎學金委員會進行複審後送交本校外國學生申請入學暨獎學金審查小 組決審。
- 第三條 本要點所稱之外國學生為符合教育部【外國學生來台就學辦法】規定之外國學生。
- 第四條 申請對象及資格概依「國立東華大學理工學院外國學生南向獎學金施行<u>細則</u>」(本院 細則)第四條規定之。
- 第五條 獎學金名額與內容依本院細則第五條規定,且包含獎學金內容:
 - (一) 生活津貼:每月新臺幣 6.000 元。
 - (二) 研究獎勵金:每月新臺幣 8,000 元(含)以上。
 - (三) 學雜費全免:不含住宿費與其他相關費用(如代辦費、保險費及網路使用費)。
- 第六條 核給期間、年限及方式
 - 一、本獎學金獲獎期間由新生入學當年開始發放至多三年(六學期),<u>第七學期起</u> 獎學金給予條件由本系另訂之。
 - 二、 生活津貼一年核給 12 個月,由國際事務處依審核名單於受獎期間,每月匯入 獲核定受獎者在本國銀行或郵局之帳戶。
 - 三、研究獎勵金一年核給 12 個月,由各指導教授於學生受獎期間配合支付,每月 匯入獲核定受獎者在本國銀行或郵局之帳戶新臺幣 8,000 元(含)以上,並送國 際處備查。研究獎勵金得以各指導教授或指導教授所屬學院系項下經費或計畫 支應,並依相關辦法及規定辦理。
 - 四、 本獎學金於新生申請入學時同步審定核發人選。
- 第七條 獲核定受獎者,於受獎期間必須遵守下列規範及義務:
 - 一、 應於本校規定期限內完成註冊手續。
 - 二、 未受學校申誡處分(含)以上懲處。
 - 三、 應維持本校在學學生身分,因故休學或退學者,註銷受獎資格,並停止發給生

活津貼及研究獎勵金。

- 四、 獲獎之新生,不得申請保留入學資格。
- 五、 除應滿足本院<u>細則</u>之規定,本系獲頒本獎學金之學生,於受獎期間需滿足下列 條件:
 - (一) 每學期至少修習一門課,成績平均至少達 A-以上(含 A-)。
 - (二)每學年須繳交書面研究成果及指導教授推薦函,由本系教學委員會審查,做為後續補助之依據。
- 六、未滿足上述條件者,將撤銷其獲獎資格,並於事實發生之次月起停發獎學金, 惟遇特殊事故且經本系教學委員會與系所主管,及本院國際事務暨獎學金委員 會與院長,及本校外國學生申請入學暨獎學金審查小組同意者,不在此限。
- 第八條 獲核定受獎者,經查若有偽造、不實及重複領取之情事,撤銷其獲獎資格,已領取 之獎學金應予繳回。

第九條 指導教授與本系相關規範

- 一、若學生符合本<u>要點</u>獲獎與授獎資格相關規範並受獎期領滿六學期後,未能獲得東華獎學金<u>但符合第六條第一款者</u>,其指導教授應提供該生後續每月 4000 元之生活津貼。
- 二、 若指導教授無法負擔,則由本系協助負擔生活津貼費用。
- 第十條 本要點如有未盡事宜,依本院、本校或教育部相關規定辦理。
- 第十一條本要點經系務會議及本院行政主管會議通過後實施,並送國際處備查。

National Dong Hwa University Department of Applied Mathematics Implementation Guidelines for the Southbound International Student Scholarship

Revised and approved at the 2nd Department Affair Council Meeting in the 2nd semester of academic year 2016-2017, June 7, 2017 Revised and approved at the 5th College Meeting of Administrative Directors in the 2nd semester of academic year 2016-2017, June 15, 2017

- Article 1 The Department of Applied Mathematics ("the Department") of the College of Science and Engineering ("the College") at National Dong Hwa University ("the University"), in order to coordinate with the University's implementation of the Southbound Scholarship, has formulated the Implementation Guidelines for the Southbound International Student Scholarship ("the Guidelines"), which will be put on trial run for three years since the academic year 2017-2018.
- Article 2 The first review of the Department Southbound International Student Scholarship ("the Scholarship") applications is conducted by the Admissions Committee of the Department, which also determines the priority order of the recommended recipients. The International Affairs and Scholarship Committee of the College shall conduct the second review and submit the review result to the University's International Student Admissions and Scholarship Application Review Committee for the final review.
- Article 3 The international student in the Guidelines refers to an international student pursuant to the Ministry of Education regulations of International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.
- Article 4 The definition of an eligible applicant and qualifications for application shall apply to Article 4 of the National Dong Hwa University College of Science and Engineering Implementation Rules of the Southbound International Student Scholarship (the "College Rules").
- Article 5 The contents of the Scholarship and the number of the recipients shall apply to Article 5 of the College Rules. The contents of the Scholarship are as follows:
 - (1) Living Allowances: NTD6,000 per month.
 - (2) Research Grants: At least NTD8,000 per month.
 - (3) A full waiver of tuition and fees (not including accommodation fees and others such as collection fees, insurance, and internet access).

Article 6 Scholarship Duration and Issuance

1. The issuance of the Scholarship begins with the semester in which a recipient enrolls at the University and extends for at most three consecutive years (*i.e.*, six consecutive semesters). As for the grants since the recipient's seventh semester of the study, the Department shall formulate the conditions separately.

- 2. Living Allowances are paid for twelve months per year and remitted monthly to a recipient's savings account of a bank or Chunghwa Post in Taiwan by the University's Office of International Affairs within the duration of the Scholarship.
- 3. Research Grants are paid for twelve months per year and remitted monthly to a recipient's savings account of a bank or Chunghwa Post in Taiwan upon the application of the recipient's advising professor(s); the monthly applications shall be sent to the University's Office of International Affairs for future reference. The Research Grants can be budgeted under the funding or project(s) of a recipient's advising professor(s) or of the department or college that a recipient's advising professor(s) is/are affiliated and shall be processed in accordance with related rules and regulations.
- 4. Recipients of the Scholarship will be reviewed and selected together with the review of the applications for admission to the University.
- Article 7 A recipient of the Scholarship must comply with the following regulations and obligations within the duration of the Scholarship:
 - 1. Complete registration within the University's prescribed time limit.
 - 2. Never be given a formal reprimand or more severe punishment by the University.
 - 3. Maintain a full-time student status at the University; suspension or withdrawal of the student status for any reason will result in the revocation of the Scholarship and the termination of the Living Allowances and Research Grants.
 - 4. A new student who wins the Scholarship cannot apply for the deferral of admission to the University.
 - 5. In addition to the College Rules, a recipient of the Scholarship from the Department also has to meet the following conditions:
 - (1) Take at least one course every semester and have a minimum academic average of A-.
 - (2) Submit a written report of the research results and a letter of recommendation from the advising professor(s) in every academic year, both of which will be reviewed by the Teaching Committee of the Department and serve as the basis for subsequent grants.
 - 6. If a recipient of the Scholarship fails to meet the conditions described in the preceding subparagraphs, the Scholarship will be revoked immediately and the grants will be terminated starting from the next month since any violation of the conditions occurs except for any special circumstances permitted by the Teaching Committee and Chair of the Department, the International Affairs and Scholarship Committee and Dean of the College, and the International Student Admissions and Scholarship Application Review Committee of the University.
- Article 8 If a recipient of the Scholarship is investigated and found committing forgery and dishonesty or concurrently receiving other same grants from the Scholarship, the

Scholarship will be revoked and the entirety of the grants received shall be returned.

- Article 9 Related regulations concerning a recipient's advising professor(s) and the Department
 - 1. If a student of the Department who meets the related regulations concerning the qualifications for the Scholarship in the Guidelines and has received the full grants for six consecutive semesters fails to win the University Scholarship for International Students later but still meets the provisions of Article 6, Subparagraph 1, the student's advising professor(s) shall provide the student with NTD4,000 per month as the living allowance since the student's seventh semester of the study.
 - 2. If a student's advising professor(s) cannot afford to provide the living allowances described in the preceding subparagraph, the Department will help cover the cost of the student's living allowances.
- Article 10 Matters not specified in the Guidelines shall be undertaken in accordance with related rules and regulations of the College, the University, or the Ministry of Education.
- Article 11 The Guidelines are implemented after being approved by the Department Affairs Meeting and the College Meeting of Administrative Directors and reported to the University's Office of International Affairs for future reference.
